

Getting there

By car

Take the N72 from Dungarvan or Tallow to Cappoquin, then take the R669 to Mount Melleray, which is signposted.

By public transport

We have arranged for a mini bus to take JYMers from Waterford train station to Mount Melleray which will meet the 15:10 train from Dublin Heuston, arriving in Waterford at 17:33. This minibus will take JYMers back to Waterford on Monday 5 April, arriving on time for the 13:00 train back to Dublin (arriving at 15:30).

If you would like a place on this bus (whether you are travelling on the Dublin train or not), please let us know by 15 March so we can make sure we have hired a big enough bus.

If you want to take public transport from another direction, you'll need to catch a bus to Cappoquin and let us know in advance that you'll need to be collected from Cappoquin.

Junior Yearly Meeting, or JYM, is an annual gathering for young Quakers (anyone between 14 and 18 -- you don't have to be a Member, just be interested and willing to get involved) from all over the island of Ireland. This year's theme, **'What canst thou say: ethical questions for young Friends today'**, will be explored through workshops and small-group discussion sessions, with plenty of time left over for games, entertainment and free time to just get to know other young Quakers.

If you haven't been to JYM before, we'd love you to come along this year. JYM is a wonderfully welcoming event, and year after year people become the best of friends over just a few days. What will we be doing?

A typical day starts with Meeting for Worship once we've eaten our breakfast. We'll have two main sessions during the day, one in the morning and one in the afternoon, where we explore our theme in depth as a large group.

We also divide into 'base groups' twice a day - smaller groups of 6-8 people where participants can feel comfortable discussing issues arising from the main sessions in more depth. Base groups become like our JYM families while we're at JYM: you'll get to know the people in your base group well, and your base group leader will look out for you while you're at JYM.

When we're not exploring the theme in sessions and base groups, we have plenty of fun: there are lots of games and activities to entertain you and let you get to know other JYMers.
